



In exchange for a year of full-time service, AmeriCorps State members earn a living allowance of \$11,800, health benefits, child care, if eligible and receive a Segal AmeriCorps Education Award of \$5,350 beginning with 2010 funding. Part-time members serve 300 to 900 hours and receive an adjusted living allowance and prorated educational award.
