



UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT TRANSFER WITHIN CONNECTICUT PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATION FALL 1994 — FALL 1995

- A total of 4,601 undergraduates transferred within the Connecticut public higher education system from the fall semester 1994 to the fall semester 1995. This represented 5.6% of undergraduate enrollment in 1994.
- Of these transfers, 2,078 (45.2%) involved students moving from two-year campuses or institutions to four-year; 984 (21.4%) transferred from one two-year campus or institution to another; 970 (21.1%) transferred from a four-year institution to a two-year campus or institution; and 569 (12.4%) transferred from one four-year institution to another.
- The largest flow of student transfers was from the Community-Technical Colleges to the four Connecticut State Universities (1,521 or 33.1% of all transfers); the second largest flow was from the Connecticut State Universities to the Community-Technical Colleges (734 or 16.0%); and the third largest flow was from one Community-Technical College to another (733 or 15.9%).
- The institutions or campuses which received the most intra-system transfer students were Central Connecticut State University (843), the University of Connecticut at Storrs (721), and Southern Connecticut State University (554).
- Among two-year institutions and campuses, the five UConn branches averaged 19.2% of their 1994 enrollment transferring to some four-year institution by the fall of 1995; the 12 Community-Technical Colleges averaged 3.7%.
- These numbers somewhat undercount the total amount of intra-system transfer because they do not include students who either transferred first between the fall semester 1994 and the spring semester 1995 and then transferred a second time between the spring semester 1995 and the fall semester 1995. Nor do they include those who transferred between the fall semester 1994 and the spring semester 1995 and then left the public system in the fall semester 1995.
